Island City Tour

Take in a breathtaking view and a look into the culture and history of the Island at Putan Dos Amantes, known in English as Two Lovers Point. Travel to the heart of the island to experience Guam's historical sites. View the island's capital of Hagatna at Fort Agueda overlook, a Spanish historic site built in the 1800s with cannons still overlooking Hagatna Bay. Travel to the Dulce Nombre de Maria Cathedral-Basilica, the center of Catholic faith on Guam, which many believe that this magnificent Church was built on the same site as Guam's first Catholic Church. Walk through the Plaza De Espana, home to the governor's palace during the Spanish period. Unlike any modern park, a Latte Stone Park gives its visitors an ancient Chamorro experience while walking through the native pillars of latte stones. Lastly, end your trip at I Sengsong Chamorro (Chamorro Village). Home to numerous gift shops featuring the work of local artists and craftsmen. Every Wednesday evening, the village hosts a night market that has become a favorite among both locals and visitors. Complete with live music, cultural dancing, and a wide selection of Chamorro, Asian, and Pacific Island delicacies, the market is home to vendors selling everything from clothing to handicrafts, bananas to betel nuts.

Southern Island Tour

Start your tour overlooking Tumon Bay at Putan Dos Amantes, also known in English as Two Lovers Point, where you will learn about local folklore. Explore historic preservation and shared stories found across the landscapes of our nation during World War II at the T. Stell Newman. From the high vantage point in Guam's scenic southern mountains, the Cetti Bay overlooks a breathtaking ocean view where you can also see nearby Cocos Island. Make your way to the charming village of Umatac; here Spanish Bridges are a few original examples of Spanish architecture that still stand in their original locations since 1785. Today the bridge still spans over the same river it did many years ago. One of the last Spanish Forts, the Fort Soledad was constructed in the 19th Century in the support of the Spanish Galleon trade. It still sits till this day on the cliff with a commanding view of the Bay. A popular spot for both residents and visitors alike, the Inarajan Pools is a natural system of swimming holes just off the main road near the village catholic church. Lastly, travel back in time at Gef Pa'go to when bread was baked in ovens, ropes were hand woven, and when the women of Guam were frocked in bright colored skirts.
